## 2007 at a Glance...

The Center for Family Resources provides many programs and services to help those in need break the cycle of poverty and become independent and self-sufficient. During 2007, CFR provided the following:

- Assisted 293 families with rent or utility payments, totaling \$182,204.95;
- Fed 2,716 households, 7,949 people, with food from the food pantry;
- Housed 239 individuals (90 adults and 149 children) through the Short-Term and Transitional Housing Programs;
- Encouraged 29 youth through the Mentoring Program, which serves at-risk youth with the help of community volunteers;
- Partnered with 59 people from 4 neighborhoods in the Community Leadership Development Program, which empowers communities with the knowledge and skills needed to work together to solve neighborhood problems;
- Conducted GED classes, life skills training, career counseling, and job skills training for 340 people; and
- Welcomed community and individual volunteers, who provided more than 8,300 hours to assist CFR programs and services - a dollar value of nearly \$157,000.



# Volunteer Spotlight

The Center for Family Resources recognizes the invaluable efforts put forth by our many volunteers. In 2007, CFR and its clients benefited from more than 8,300 hours of services provided by committed volunteers that included members of our Board of Directors, committee members, Junior League members, Oscar Night® America 2007 volunteers, Thanksgiving volunteers, mentors, professional organizations, and individual community members.

Whether they were assisting with in-take, offering a helping hand around the office, or teaching one of our educational classes, volunteers continued to play an integral role in the day-to-day operations of CFR.

Volunteer commitment increased during 2007, with more than 270 volunteers participating in CFR's Thanksgiving Program, more volunteers than ever in the event's history.

Seventeen volunteers committed more than 50 direct hours during 2007. Of note, Annette Harlow completed the greatest number of hours of all the volunteers during 2007. Also, local Boy Scout Tom Loizzo spent six weeks on the CFR premises completing a garden and landscaping as part of an Eagle Scout project.
